## From Pastor's David's Desk

As a child traveling with my family over dusty bumpy cobblestone one lane "highways" in the Andes mountains, I always wanted to know how far we were from the equator monument that marked the half way point of our usual journey north. There we would stop for a cold pop, brush the dust off our clothes and wait for our ears to stop ringing from the constant drone of the tires on the paving stones. Then, when we were recombobulated we would begin the second three to four hours of the journey. The stop always revived us by giving us a sense of progress and physical renewal.

In the OT Joshua had the Israelites set up an altar near the shore of the Jordan river after they had entered the promised land. It was to be a reminder to Israel to tell their children what God had done for them, how far they had come and reassure them for what lay ahead.

This year as a church we will arrive in April at the one hundred year milestone of life as a congregation. Already our centennial events have allowed us to celebrate God's blessing through life and ministry at Bethany. It has been a time of spiritual refreshment and reflection. But as we are renewed we need also hear the call to get back on the road of service and ministry that God has called us. The road to come will be a winding, dusty, bumpy road but we will rejoice because God is working out his plan in our lives and in the life of the Church. Peter writes to the church on the way, "you are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls." (1 Peter 1:9)



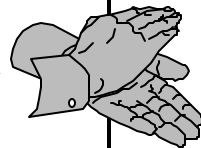

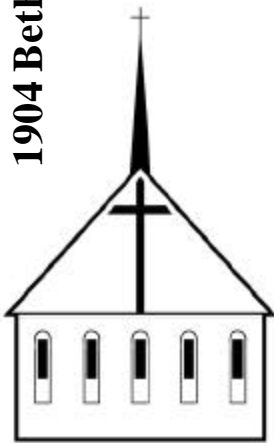

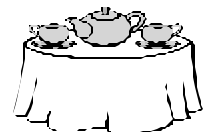

### Security

There have been several breaches of security at church in recent months. The "Keeping Churches Safer" Committee would like to remind everyone to lock the church doors. If you are meeting at church, lock the doors after everyone in your group has entered, and of course lock up after the last person is out of the building.

### **Fofo yiigiraabe (friends),**

Many years ago a television personality, Art Lin kletter, was known for interviewing young children. The responses to his questions were often quite amusing. I remember once him asking a question something like, "If someone gave you a million dollars, how would you spend it? How many times have you asked yourself that question? Quite honestly I wonder what I would do. I could build a ministry center for Fulani outreach; or help small cell/prayer groups get land + build; or distribute literature to elementary school students; or even set up a "refuge" to temporarily receive formerly Muslim believers as they start their new life. But now there is a new challenge on the horizon. Namely to establish a new radio station in the Fulani-dominated north. The city of Djibo is a strategic Fulani center with a large animal market that draws Fulani for hundreds of miles. I have agreed to collaborate in this effort as it has the potential for sizable impact. So add the purchase of land, raising a radio tower and the procurement of studio and broadcasting equipment to the list above. The biggest challenge at this point, however, is obtaining the national broadcast license. More on this later. But at the same time I need to heed the lesson I often share with local leaders. Jesus established his kingdom on the soil of human hearts. Pray that we remember that land, equipment, organizations are secondary to sustained witness of the faithful. May this also be a challenge to you today. Press on, as all the riches of God's kingdom are already ours through our Lord Jesus.

- 4] January 27-February 1 Jill and I will be attending a Fulani team prayer day and the SIM Spiritual Life Conference here in Ouaga. Pray that this will be a time of spiritual refreshment for the whole SIM team. Also pray that the Lord will provide guidance to ministries and individuals.
- 5] Rejoice with us as we have decided to move to a new house this April. We will miss our present neighborhood but it is in a more centrally located area, has additional space for ministry and won't require as much transport of Elli to school/friends.

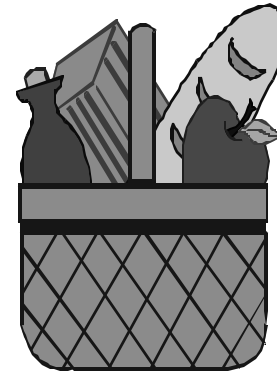

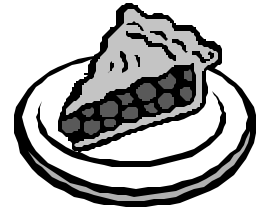
